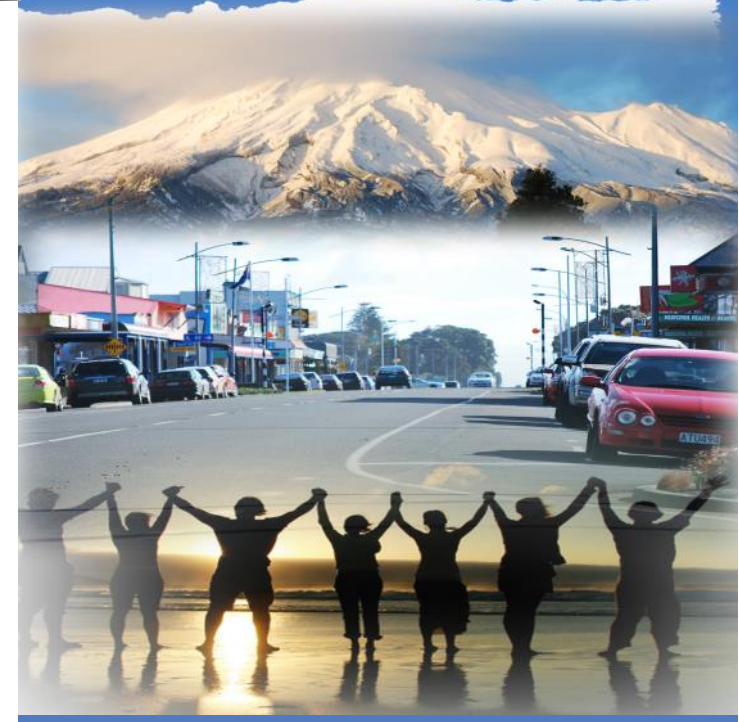

Driving Distance and Times

Opunake to New Plymouth	55 mins—62 km
Opunake to Hawera	35 mins—43 km
New Plymouth to Hawera	1 hr 30 mins—105 km
New Plymouth to Hamilton	3 hrs 20 mins—241 km



Drive along the scenic Surf Highway 45, catch glimpses of sea and lush green dairy pasture which the coast is famous for. Another attribute is our amazing natural surf breaks dotted along the coast road. Visit the Cape Egmont Lighthouse down the Cape and Bayly Roads, one the real thing, the other a newly built replica.

Opunake, pronounced O-puna-ke means 'the place of the prow of the canoe', has a population of around 1600 people and swells to over 2000 in the summer months. This amazing crescent shaped beach, voted one of the best swimming beaches in New Zealand, boasts terrific camping grounds, good swimming and fishing and a warm sunny spot for your holidays.

The shopping centre, relaxing cafes and lake are just a 2 minute walk from the beach.

Things to see in Opunake

Opunake Beach is one of the finest swimming beaches in New Zealand. The beach is a wonderful place for picnics and has a gas barbeque, a children's playground and paddling pool and is one of the access points to the Opunake Walkway. The beach is a short walk from the town.



The Opunake Lake began generating power in 1922. Before this it was a natural basin of land and was the vegetable garden that supplied the Armed Constabulary in the 1880's. Today the lake is a playground for recreational water sports of all kinds. There are trout and eels for fishing as well as a safe haven for water fowl. The walkway begins or ends at the lake.



Cape Egmont Lighthouse was erected on Taranaki's west coast's most western point in 1881. It was bought up from Mana Island, Wellington by ship and bought ashore in pieces and reassembled. The lighthouse was electrified in 1951 by a diesel generator and later was connected to the national grid. The light could be seen from 22 nautical miles. These days a replica, complete with the original lens and lantern, stands beside the Cape Egmont Boat Club, 332 Bayly Road, Warea.



Mt Taranaki is an active but quiescent stratovolcano and is 2518m high. It is one of the symmetrical cone shaped volcanoes in the world. It last erupted around 1850-60. Egmont National Park surrounds Mt Taranaki in a 9.8 km radius. There are many tramping tracks around the mountain. Please enquire at DOC offices situated around the mountain before venturing out.

You will find **Opunake's Mural Trail** within the shopping area. There are a number of large murals which depict Opunake's history. The newest one painted on the Chemist Shop wall. See the Mural pamphlet at the Opunake Library Plus.



Beside the TSB bank there is a large bronze statue of **Sir Peter Snell**. Peter Snell was born in 1938 at the Opunake Cottage Hospital and attended primary school here. He went on to win three Olympic and two Commonwealth gold medals in Athletics.



Maui Production Station, Tai Road, Oaonui. In 1979, natural gas and condensate production began from the Maui A Off Shore Platform station at Oaonui, 8 kms north of Opunake. The Visitors Information Centre is open daily from 8 am—5.30 pm. See scale models of the Off Shore Platform and Installation.
