## Plumbo Solvency

Some plumbing fittings have the potential to let minute traces of metals accumulate in water standing in the fittings for several hours. Although the health risk is small, the Ministry of Health recommends you flush a mugful of water from your drinking water tap each morning before use to remove any metals that may have dissolved from the plumbing fittings. We recommend this simple precaution for all households, including those on public and private water supplies.

## Funding Recommended for Stage 1 of Business Park

Stage one of the Council's Business Park initiative got the green light last week with the Policy and Strategy Committee recommending that Council approve up to \$3 million for water, stormwater and roading infrastructure, to be installed in the Waihi Road mixed use area in Hāwera.

Located on the western side of Waihi Road, SH3, the area contains a mixture of residential, commercial and industrial properties and was identified in a 2019 Feasibility Study as the most suitable location for the development of a District Business Park.

Chief Executive, Waid Crockett, says installing the infrastructure will support existing properties in the area and lays the foundations for Stage 1 of the Business Park development.

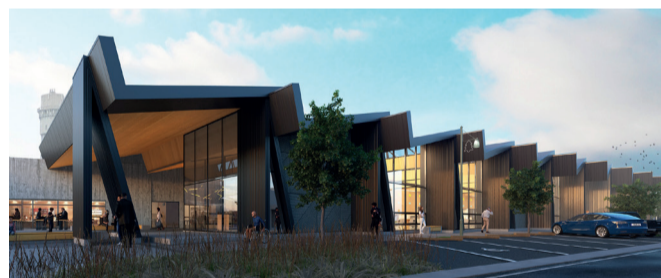
"It means we can provide the existing businesses and potential new businesses with the confidence they need when making decisions about where they might

go and whether they expand. We are already working with an anchor business which has purchased land within the area identified for the Business Park. This is a new business to the District which intends to be operating on the site by October 2021 with a large hardware distribution warehouse."

Mr Crockett says the Council's Business Park investment is a strategic initiative designed to support the COVID-19 recovery and drive investment, resilience and economic growth in the District. "The \$3 million will initially be funded by the Council's Long Term Investment Fund and recovered over time through financial contributions from developers and other funding sources," he says.

Subsequent funding of stages two and three of the Business Park will be included in the Council's 2021-2031 Long Term Plan and budgeted over a number of years.

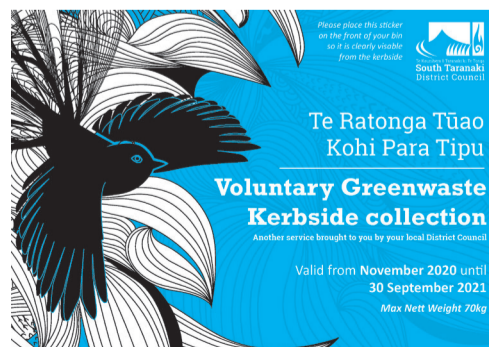
The following information is required:

- It is anticipated for demolition to be undertaken through December 2020 to February 2021, please confirm capability and resources to meet these dates;
- Insurance certificates (current) for Public Liability,

Motor Vehicles and Plant;

- Two examples of similar demolition projects (ie. CBD precinct);
- Your company's staffing and plant resources;
- Minor builders work (ie. fencing, making good to adjacent buildings etc), confirm this resource;
- The project includes ACM (asbestos containing materials) removal and disposal, confirm licensed for asbestos removal and preferred disposal dump site;
- Confirm ability to provide a Demolition Plan in accordance with specific Resource Consent condition;
- Confirm ability to provide all H&S, SSSP and traffic/pedestrian management plans.
