Whakarāpopoto Kāhui Kahika / Executive Summary

- 1. The Council released its Initial Proposal for consultation on 12 August 2021 and by the closing date of 23 September, 39 submissions had been received. Of those 60 70% supported the Initial Proposal for both the general and Māori wards. Three submitters and one other person requested to speak and will be heard at the commencement of this meeting.
- 2. The Council is now required to adopt a Final Proposal that it considers will best reflect the District's communities of interest and provide fair and effective representation, as required by the Local Electoral Act 2001.
- 3. The Council can either make changes to the Initial Proposal, based on the submissions received, or confirm the Initial Proposal as its Final Proposal. It must publicly notify the Final Proposal and is required to state the reasons for any amendments and the reasons for rejecting any submissions. Therefore, the reasons must be recorded in the resolution.

Taunakitanga / Recommendations

THAT the Council;

- a) **Receives** submissions 1 39 to the Council's Initial Proposal for representation arrangements and notes that these submissions are considered as part of the Council's deliberations and Final Proposal for the District's representation arrangements for at least the 2022 local authority elections.
- b) **Confirms**, after considering the submissions, its Initial Proposal that for at least the 2022 local authority elections, 13 Council members will be elected from six wards that reflect the identified communities of interest, as set out in the following table, in accordance with sections 19H, 19K and 19T of the Local Electoral Act 2001, for the reasons that, of the options considered, this is the 'best fit' for providing fair and effective representation of the District's communities of interest while recognising the needs of geographically distinct communities.

This ward largely encompasses the parts of the Ngāti Ruanui and Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi rohe that are within the South Taranaki District. This ward does not meet the +/-10% population requirement but the boundary was defined by Ngāruahine and Ngāti Ruanui.
Taranaki Coastal General Ward	2	Reduces the current Taranaki Coastal Ward area by moving: Part of the north east boundary west from Auroa Road to Ōeo Road to include part of the current Taranaki Coastal Ward in the Eltham- Kaponga Ward. Part of the north and east boundary from Skeet Road and the Waingongoro River south to Tempsky and Ōmahuru Roads to include part of the current Taranaki Coastal Ward in the Eltham- Kaponga Ward. The south east boundary from the Waingongoro River west to Inaha Road to include part of the current Taranaki Coastal Ward in the Te Hāwera Ward (including Ōkaiawa).
Eltham-Kaponga General Ward	2	Increases the current Eltham Ward slightly by moving: Part of the western boundary from Auroa Road to Ōeo Road to include part of the current Taranaki Coastal Ward in the Eltham- Kaponga Ward. Part of the southern boundary from Skeet Road and the Waingongoro River south to Tempsky and Ōmahuru Roads and from the current Eltham-Kaponga Ward boundary south to Onewhaia, Boylan and Austin Roads and the Mangemange Stream to include part of the current Taranaki Coastal Ward and part of the current Te Hāwera Ward in the Eltham-Kaponga Ward.

Although it does not comply with the +/- 10% population requirement as it has less people per councillor than other wards, the Council believes that the ward should remain the same because of geographical and historical factors.

c) **Notes** that some submissions opposed to the Initial Proposal be declined on the following grounds:

Having considered fair and effective representation of the District's communities of interest while recognising the needs of geographically distinct communities, the total number of elected members remains at 13 (plus the Mayor) for the following reasons:

- To reflect the establishment of two Māori wards in accordance with the Council's resolution on 11 November 2020;
- The issues of the establishment of Māori wards and election of Māori ward councillors cannot be considered as part of this review;
- To provide effective and accessible representation to all communities of interest within the District;
- To reflect the feedback received through the pre-consultation undertaken from 9 June to 9 July 2021.
- To reflect the 2020 population figures provided by Statistics New Zealand.
- d) **Confirms**, after considering submissions, its Initial Proposal for at least the 2022 local authority elections that there will be four Community Boards, each represented by four community board members elected by the electors of the communities, as described in the table below, in accordance with section 19J of the Local Electoral Act 2001, for the reasons that there is support from all community boards and a majority of submitters for the proposal and it provides fair and effective representation of these communities.

- e) **Notes** that the Final Proposal will be publicly notified in accordance with Section 19N of the Local Electoral Act 2001 and provides the opportunity for objections/appeals to be lodged in the period 14 October 2021 to 25 November 2021.
- f) Notes that should the Initial Proposal be adopted as the Final Proposal, this will need to be forwarded to the Local Government Commission for determination as it does not comply with the +/-10% population requirement set out in Section 19V (2) of the Local Electoral Act 2001 (East Māori Ward [+15.9%], West Māori Ward [-15.9%], Taranaki Coastal General Ward [+15.8%] and Pātea General Ward [-27.3%]).

Kupu Whakamārama / Background

- 4. The Council resolved at its Extraordinary meeting on 11 November 2020 "to introduce Māori representation via Māori wards for the 2022 and 2025 triennial elections and lobby Central Government to review the Local Electoral Act including removing the ability for Māori wards to be subject to a demand for a poll." The Council's decision triggered a representation review and the ability to demand a poll on Māori wards was removed from the Local Electoral Act in March 2021.
- 5. A workshop was held on 1 March 2021 to consider a range of options for the District's representation. Five general ward options and two Māori ward options were selected at that workshop for further consideration. At the second workshop on 3 May, three general ward options and two Māori ward options were chosen for informal consultation between 8 June and 9 July. By 9 July, 62 responses had been received, but no clear preference was identified.

6. At the Extraordinary meeting on 4 August 2021 the Council adopted an Initial Proposal for consultation that proposed four general wards, two Māori wards with a total of 13 councillors (plus the Mayor) and four community boards to align with each of the general wards and consisting of four elected members per board. This was publicly notified on 12 August. Submissions closed on 23 September and 39 were received and there was a clear preference for the Initial Proposal as presented. Only three submitters wished to speak to their submission.

Local Government Purpose

7. This decision aligns with the purpose of the Local Government Act 2002 as it enables democratic local decision-making by, and on behalf of the community to promote the cultural, social, economic and environmental well-being of the community in the present and for the future.

Ngā Kōwhiringa / Options – Identification and analysis

- 8. The majority of submitters supported the Council's Initial Proposal (56.4% for the general wards part and 69.2% for the Māori wards part). Two submitters requested that the Te Hāwera General Ward be split into two making five general wards and one submitter requested that the number of Te Hāwera Ward councillors is reduced. Three submitters did not support the Council's proposal to move the boundary from Auroa Road to Ōeo Road (Taranaki Coastal and Eltham-Kaponga General Wards boundary).
- 9. One submitter believed there should be a maximum of three councillors in a ward and the number should be based on the rates collected from each ward, not the population. One submitter requested that the non-compliance for representation in the Taranaki Coastal General Ward be reduced.
- 10. Several submitters did not support the decision to establish Māori wards, however the issues of the establishment of Māori wards and election of Māori ward councillors cannot be considered as part of this review.
- 11. Names suggested for the East and West Māori wards include:
 - Northern Māori Ward and Southern Māori Ward
 - Hauauru Māori Ward and Rawhiti Māori Ward
 - West Māori Ward and East Māori Ward
 - Taranaki Takutai Māori Ward and Taranaki ki Rāwhiti Māori Ward
 - Te Tai Tonga Māori Ward
- 12. Ngaa Rauru and Ngāti Ruanui met and recommended Te Tai Tonga Māori Ward for the East Ward (the southern ward within South Taranaki).
- 13. The description of the boundary between the Māori wards has been amended to make it more accurate, as the description in the Initial Proposal did not include the words, "a line north west to Boylan Road; Boylan Road to Austin Road; Austin Road to its intersection with Ketemarae Road;". The area within this description was shown on the Initial Proposal map. The word "Boylan" has also been added to the descriptions of the Eltham-Kaponga and Te Hāwera General Wards.

Risks

14. As long as the Council follows the process set out in the Local Electoral Act 2001, the risks are low. This includes meeting the statutory deadlines and ensuring that, for example, when deciding on the Final Proposal, no major changes are made to the Initial Proposal that are beyond the scope of any points raised in the submissions.

Options available

- 15. Having adopted and consulted on an Initial Proposal, the Council's options are now limited. As noted above, the only changes that can be made to the Initial Proposal now must be in response to matters raised by submitters during the formal consultation phase. Consequently, only two options are available.
- 16. Option One is to confirm the Initial Proposal, as presented, as the Final Proposal.
- 17. Option Two is to make minor alterations to the Initial Proposal in response to matters raised during the formal consultation phase of the representation review process and confirm the revised Initial Proposal as the Final Proposal.

- 18. The Council's general approach to determining the level of "significance" is to consider:

- 19. The Representation Review is of medium significance in terms of the Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.
- 20. Both informal and formal consultation on the Representation Review have been undertaken. The Local Electoral Act 2001 requires formal consultation, and the Council chose to consult informally as well. Public notices were placed in the Taranaki Star newspaper and on the Council's website and Facebook page. Emails and letters were also sent to residents/landowners in the areas where changes to the ward boundaries are proposed, in an effort to reach as many people as possible.

Legislative Considerations

21. The representation review process is prescribed under sections 19A-19Z of the Local Electoral Act 2001 and the Council's review has complied with the Act's requirements.

Financial/Budget Considerations

22. The Council had not budgeted for a representation review in 2021, but the costs are relatively minor and are being absorbed within existing budgets. The proposal to increase the number of councillors to 13 would have no significant financial implications, as the funding pool determined by the Remuneration Authority is not dependent on the number of elected members. There would be a small increase in elected members' travel and other expenses.

Environmental Sustainability

23. The Representation Review does not contribute to the District's environmental sustainability, but neither does it have any adverse environmental impacts.

Consistency with Plans/Policies/Community Outcomes

24. Nothing in this report is inconsistent with any Council policy, plan or strategy and the Representation Review contributes to the Council's Vibrant South Taranaki (cultural well-being) and Together South Taranaki (social well-being) community outcomes.

Impact on Māori/Iwi

25. This decision will have a positive impact on Māori and Iwi as two councillors will be elected by Māori to represent their interests. This is another step towards developing partnerships with Iwi and encouraging Māori to contribute to the Council's decision-making processes.

Affected Parties Consultation

26. Every reasonable endeavour has been made to consult with affected parties, in this case every resident and ratepayer in the District and particularly those who live and/or own land in the areas where changes to the ward boundaries are proposed.

Whakakapia / Conclusion

27. Having considered the submissions received, the Council is now required to adopt a Final Proposal for at least the 2022 local authority elections that it believes will best reflect the District's communities of interest and provide fair and effective representation in accordance with the Local Electoral Act 2001. Any amendments to the Initial Proposal must be within the scope of the submissions received.







Submission to South Taranaki District Council on their Representation Review

OUR SUBMISSION

- 1. Federated Farmers welcomes the opportunity to submit to South Taranaki District Council (council) on the Representation Review 2021.
- 2. Federated Farmers represents well over 500 members in the South Taranaki District. Our members this time of the year are busy lambing, calving, and with breeding coming up they rely on the weighting of our submission to be considered appropriately.
- 3. Our policy advisors have experience working with every district council in New Zealand ensuring rural representation is fair and effective for the rural zone. Our submissions come with careful consideration and a supporting background on why the organisation requests certain actions of the council for representation reviews.
- 4. The initial proposal is to establish 13 councillors and a mayor. This will be comprised of two Māori wards with one councillor each and four general wards all with two councillors apart from Te Hawera with five councillors. There will be one Mayor elected at large. This was chosen after initial feedback with several options of structures.
- 5. We do thank council for the effort undertaken to open feedback prior to the initial proposal. The several options proposed helped the community understand different options other than what is currently occurring.

In short

- We support the Wards system.
- The decision to have two councillors representing their own Māori Ward is also supported.
- Federated Farmers wants a reduction in councillors from 13. This should come from the Te Hawera ward.
- If the council were to reduce councillors, we would support the continuation of community boards.
- 6. The decision to have two wards for Māori representation is accepted by the Federation. It is an effective way to get fair and equal representation for the Māori constituency around the district.
- 7. Federated Farmers does however have concerns with the number of councillors and the number representing the Te Hawera Ward when compared against the rest of the district. Federated Farmers Taranaki believe that to ensure fair and equal representation among the communities of interest the Te Hawera ward needs to be reduced in councillors to allow for equal representation for each ward in the council decision-making process. In our opinion the ward can be adequately represented by the smaller number of councillors as the community have the most direct access to the council offices over the rest of district living outside of Hawera.

- 8. Federated Farmers Taranaki want to propose an alternative for council to consider. We would want a reduction of councillors from the Te Hawera Ward and an overall reduction of councillors to 12 and a mayor. This would be taking option 2 from the council's initial feedback.
- 9. Our reason for doing so is we believe that there needs to be fair and equal representation for the entire district along with a need to attract our best candidates for the role. To do this we believe the number of councillors needs to drop to increase remuneration allocated per councillor. In our view council need to make being a councillor a viable career for younger and well skilled members of the district to take up. Around New Zealand there is a lack of younger councillors at the table. We also believe that there is an unnecessary number of councillors in the Te Hawera ward and that dropping a councillor from this ward will not have any effect on the ability for the community to reach out to council.
- 10. Examples of other districts similar to South Taranaki in population are South Waikato (10 councillors), Kaipara (8 councillors), and Matamata (11). Having 13 councillors does not seem to align with other district council structures and we want a structure that gives a deserving renumeration for our hard-working councillors whilst ensuring ratepayers are not bearing additional unnecessary ratepayer costs. Federated Farmers also acknowledges Waipa district (56,000 population) have proposed to drop from 13 to 11 councillors with community boards representing the two main towns in the district.
- 11. Federated Farmers understands that the running of the community boards come at a cost. From the examples above of similar sized councils only, South Waikato have community boards in place which is a single board for a small community of interest. We accept that community boards are used for speaking out for communities of interest however, we believe that an effective wards-based councillor system is more important and better represents communities of interest. We do support the continuation of community boards if the overall number of councillors is reduced. We deem community boards unnecessary if council were to have an above-average number of councillors as proposed. These 13 councillors should be able to represent their communities of interest.
- 12. Federated Farmers supports councils' proposal to continue with the wards system over at large. The adoption of an at large system can have significant effects on rural representation and communities of interest.

The Council is reviewing the representation arrangements for the District This includes the number of councillors, the number of wards and the ward boundaries

During July we asked our residents what their initial thoughts were Following the feedback we received from this pre-consultation, the Council is now coming back to you with a formal proposal (called an Initial Proposal)

Under the Initial Proposal the Council would be made up of 13 Councillors and a Mayor The Councillors would consist of two Māori wards with one councillor elected from each ward and four general wards with two councillors elected from the Eltham-Kaponga ward; two from the Pātea ward; two from the Taranaki Coastal ward; and five councillors from Te Hāwera ward

The ward boundaries shift slightly in the Initial Proposal

- The western boundary of Eltham-Kaponga Ward has moved west from Auroa Road to Ōeo Road
- Part of the southern boundary of Eltham-Kaponga Ward has moved south from Skeet Road to Tempsky, Ömahuru and Austin Roads and Mangemange Stream
- Te Hāwera Ward western boundary has moved west to Inaha Road (and now includes Ōkaiawa)

Apart from the proposed boundary changes to the wards there are no changes to the Community Boards
