Helpline available to those struggling in Lockdown

A new 0800 number for people needing urgent help accessing food, medication or other household goods and services was launched last week.

Taranaki Civil Defence Emergency Management (CDEM) Group Controller, Craig Campbell-Smart says the region is doing a great job of wrapping its arms around those who need help and Civil Defence wants to make sure no one falls through the cracks.

"As expected, we're seeing an increasing number of people needing support during this period and it's great to see family members, friends and neighbours stepping up to help those close to them," says Craig.

"Sometimes it's not possible for that support to come from family or friends, and there are many services provided locally and nationally to help in those situations, such as healthline, lifeline and local essential services like Meals on Wheels and Food Bank." "This new phone number is not a replacement for those resources but is available to ensure that no one misses out on the essentials during this period."

When seeking support for yourself or others, Taranaki Civil Defence is asking people to follow three simple steps:

- 1. Check if a family member or friend can access support.
- If the above isn't an option, phone the dedicated government helpline 0800 779 997 to find out what support is available from essential social services operating during Alert Level 4.
- 3. Taranaki CDEM can assist with urgent needs that can't be met by the above two options. Phone 0800 900 077 between 7 am and 7 pm daily.

Reminder that rubbish fires in urban areas are illegal



Across Taranaki there has been an increasing number of complaints being made about residential rubbish fires in urban areas recently. Taranaki Civil Defence Emergency Management Group Controller Craig Campbell-Smart says residential rubbish fires in urban areas are illegal so

no one should be burning rubbish on an urban property. "This is not acceptable behaviour at any time as rubbish fires cause smoke, odour and can lead to longer-term adverse health effects," says Craig. "In order to assist people with disposing of rubbish during Alert Level 4, all districts in Taranaki are currently collecting general waste on a weekly basis." "Don't burn it, bin it," says Craig. "Or if it's recyclable and you have the space available to store it safely until our recycling collections resume, then that's even better."

"Let's be sensible and get through COVID-19 by being considerate of our environment and those around us."
