Feedback Wanted on Eltham and Waverley Draft Final



Draft Final plans for the Eltham and Waverley Innovative Streets Pilot Fund trial project have been developed and your comments are needed. The project has received funding from Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and the plans are aimed at testing safer crossing points, slowing down traffic and making the towns more welcoming and vibrant.

The draft plans, which were on display in the LibraryPlus in October and workshopped with the co-design teams, have been modified after consideration of the feedback received from

the community, Waka Kotahi safety engineers and the trucking associations.

The new version will be on display at the LibraryPlus from 9 to 20 November and residents can give their thoughts on the draft final plans there, email them to *cdunit@stdc.govt.nz* or phone 0800 111 323. Feedback forms will be available on our website *www.southtaranaki.com.*

The trial street treatments will be installed in February/March and monitored to see how they are working so adjustments can be made if required.

Whether the treatments will be installed permanently will depend on feedback from the community, businesses and Waka Kotahi during the project installation to see if the treatments are successfully alleviating the issues identified in the Town Masterplans - which were developed last year including the speed of the traffic through the central business areas, unsafe crossing points and lack of a town heart.

The project is 90% funded by the Waka Kotahi Innovating Streets pilot fund with the South Taranaki District Council funding the remaining 10%.

Advise against Shellfish collection near Hāwera

Low levels of potentially harmful organisms (norovirus) in shellfish has been found after recent monitoring near the marine outfall in Hāwera (near Koutu, Pukeroa and north west reefs).

As a precaution, we advise against taking and eating shellfish from the area between Denby Road and the Manawapou Stream mouth. The Council have erected warning signs at the Denby Road beach access point, the outfall track and at the Manawapou Stream mouth access track.

At low concentrations, norovirus can be infectious to humans, resulting in sickness (such as vomiting or diarrhoea) for a few days. The affected area is monitored periodically and will ensure the public is adequately advised should there be a change. If you have queries, please contact Council by phoning on 0800 111 323.
