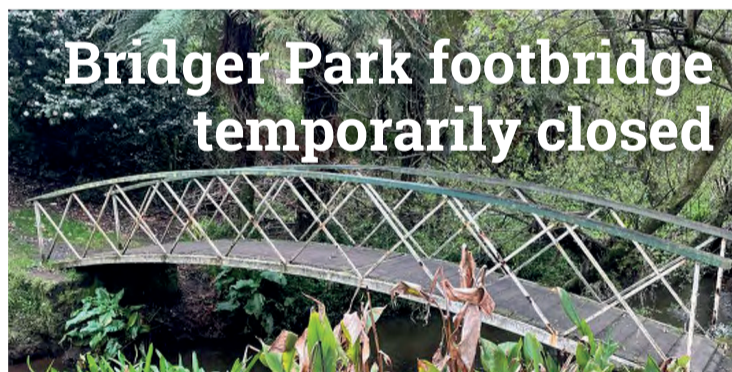

An engineer's report has recommended that the 20-year-old footbridge is closed for public safety until it has been refurbished. Work will be undertaken with the bridge in-situ and will include cleaning the structure, replacing steel work, the timber deck and painting. Due to the difficulty in getting tradespeople at the moment, there is no timeframe for when the work might begin. This is one of a number of recent upgrades including the mobility access path and the Bridge Street entrance garden area.

Arts in the Park cancelled this year

For the first time ever, Hāwera's popular annual Arts in the Park has been cancelled. "Unfortunately, with the current alert level restrictions for gatherings and the Government's Protection Framework timeline giving no certainty for events over the coming weeks - we cannot safely proceed with it," says Tourism and Events

Team Leader Tarin Hunt.

Arts in the Park Hāwera is one of the biggest events on the South Taranaki calendar and normally sees more than 90 stall holders, countless performers and thousands of people stroll through King Edward Park over the course of the day.
