Despite the continued disruption in our lives with our second year of COVID-19, 2021 has been an extremely busy and productive year. On the Council front we have undertaken a major representation review, completed our Long Term Plan for the next ten years (which focuses on economic growth, environmental sustainability and undertaking town centre upgrades in Ōpunakē, Manaia, Eltham, Pātea

and Waverley) and kept our average annual rate increase below 4%. We have started a number of our key projects such as Stage One of the District Business Park, site preparation for our new library, culture and arts centre, and the Nukumaru Station Road extension. Other projects were also completed such as Eltham's Soldiers Park and the Hāwera to Normanby

pathways, Bridger Park entrance beautification and the Manaia pool upgrade. The strong performance of our Long Term Investment Fund also saw Council receive an even higher credit rating.

Despite the many challenges of COVID-19, the news for South Taranaki has been equally positive. Our agricultural and food processing sectors have had a great year as has the construction industry with record numbers of subdivisions and new houses being built. In fact, South Taranaki ranked as having one of the fastest rates of job growth in New Zealand over the last 12 months. With exciting developments, such as Hiringa Energy's green hydrogen and ammonia project at Kapuni, the momentum looks set to continue.

Christmas is a great time for catching up with family and friends, however, please continue to do all those things you've been doing to keep yourself and your family safe and well up to this point. If you're driving over the holiday season take care on the roads, stay calm and take plenty of breaks. Have a great Christmas and a happy and healthy New Year.

Water Conservation

For the first time in many years parts of South Taranaki will likely see water restrictions this summer, largely due to new regulations.

We need to appreciate this is the new normal, not just for South Taranaki but the whole of New Zealand. We are fortunate in that we've got enough water to go around, but not enough to waste. We just need people to conserve, fix leaks, use water wisely and not be wasteful.

Check that it's Safe to Swim

Check before you take a dip! Water quality in our rivers and at our beaches is generally pretty good over summer, except in poor weather conditions. We strongly advise you not to swim for at least three days after heavy or prolonged rainfall – even if a site generally has good water quality.
