COVID-19 closes several pools

If you visited the Hāwera Aquatic Centre over Saturday 19, Sunday 20 or Monday 21 February please monitor your health and get tested if you have cold or flu symptoms.



This facility is closed while staff are tested for COVID-19 We will re-open as soon as we are able Several South Taranaki swimming pools have had to close on Tuesday after a lifeguard tested positive for COVID-19. The Hawera Aquatic Centre, Kaponga, Manaia, Eltham and Rāwhitiroa community summer pools will all be closed until further notice.

Group Manager of Community and Infrastructure Services, Fiona Aitken, says the Hāwera Aquatic Centre, where the lifeguard and a close contact worked, has been cleaned and all staff tested.

"If you or your children visited the Hawera Aquatic Centre over Saturday 19, Sunday 20 or Monday 21 February please monitor your health and get tested if you have cold or flu symptoms or if you have been a close contact. If you are unsure what you need to do contact Healthline (0800 358 5453) for advice."

Aitken says due to the numbers of staff having to self-isolate and wait for test results, most of the free community summer pools could be closed for the next few days if there is not enough staff available to operate them.

"The Council has been preparing for this eventuality across all its facilities and is following all Ministry of Health protocols. We will do our best to keep as many of our pools open for as long as possible, but our priority is keeping our staff and the community safe," she says.
