Speed Limit Review for Schools



We want everyone to be able to get home safely every time, and to feel comfortable choosing from a range of safe travel options be it driving, walking, biking, or scootering. As a Road Controlling Authority (RCA) the Council must follow the Government's Land Transport Rule - Setting of Speed Limits 2022. This Rule requires a safe and acceptable speed on all roads and that each RCA develops a Speed Management Plan.

The Rule also requires that the speeds around 40% of our schools must be reduced before 1 July 2024.

The Council has developed a Proposed Interim Speed Management Plan that focuses on reducing speeds around all South Taranaki schools before 1 July 2024. For those schools connected to a state highway we will work with Waka Kotahi - NZ Transport Agency to reduce the speed on our local (Council) roads when they reduce the speed on the state highways, to achieve a common sense and consistent approach for

A 5% decrease in average speed leads to about a 10% decrease in all injury crashes and a 20% decrease in fatal crashes.

all road users.

Speed management is about achieving safe and appropriate vehicle speeds on roads that reflect the road's function, design, safety, and use.

Over the coming weeks we will be out and about in our communities advertising and discussing the consultation document. Please ensure you have your say in the Speed Limit Review. The consultation period begins on Monday 27 February and closes on Friday 31 March 2023.
