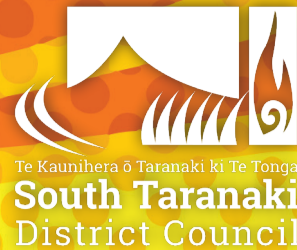

Artists explore concepts of home

A new visual arts exhibition at Lysaght Watt Gallery in Hāwera will showcase the diversity of artists in South Taranaki, featuring artworks that reflect ideas and concepts of home.

Curated by South Taranaki District Council Arts Co-ordinator Michaela Stoneman, **Kāinga : Home** will feature works in a wide variety of mediums by 45 artists from Waverley to Pūniho, and everywhere in-between.

"We have a wealth of amazing artists in South Taranaki, each with a unique voice and approach, demonstrating remarkable skill and insight. This show will host a mix of established and emerging artists from our arts community and offers a platform for connection, future collaborations and celebration of our collective creativity" Stoneman says. "I asked artists 'What does 'home' mean to you?' Artists could explore concepts of home in relation to any personal interpretation – eg. literal homes or shelter, local environment and spaces, history and storytelling. Aspects of culture, family, whakapapa, identity and beliefs reflect who we are and what is important to us."

Submitted works include painting, printmaking, collage, ceramics, sculpture, carving, raranga, jewellery, textiles, photography, assemblage and weaving. The featured artists live throughout the South Taranaki district, including Ōeo, Pūniho, Wārea, Ōhawē, Pātea, Ōpunakē, Waverley, Hāwera, Eltham, Pungarehu and Manaia. The water supply for Eltham is being turned off on Monday 24 July from **2am till 4am** to repair a fire hydrant and to install another water isolation point so less properties would be affected by water shutdowns in future.

Once work has been completed and the water has been turned back on, you might initially notice a bit of discolouration. If this is the case, we suggest you run the water from your cold tap for a short period until the water runs clear. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.

Changes to Kerbside Collection Service?

He Kohinga Ipu Para Your kerbside collection



The contract for the collection and disposal of our solid waste is coming up for renewal in October next year. In an effort to reduce the amount of waste being sent to landfill and to keep cost increases to a minimum, the Council wants to consider whether we should change the size of our kerbside wheelie bins, introduce weekly food waste collection and move from a weekly to a fortnightly kerbside collection service – or stay as we are.

We know that this service is of high interest to lots of people, so in **August** we will be consulting with you about these proposals in more detail.
