DUSK OR DAWN

Water your garden before 8am and after 6pm

TRIGGER UP

Fix a trigger nozzle to hand-held hoses

RAINING? TANK IT

Install a rainwater tank

FIX THE DRIP

Fix dripping taps and leaks around your property

WASH WISELY

Wash vehicles on the lawn. Use a bucket

TAPS OFF PLUG IN

When brushing your teeth or rinsing dishes or food

RECYCLE REUSE

Connect to recycled water for garden, toilets and laundry

LINE UP THE STARS

Choose water efficient appliances. More stars = savings

SHOWER SMART

Install a water saving shower head. Aim for shorter showers

Eltham Roadworks

Work is progressing well on the Clifford Road-Collingwood Street intersection located on the Heavy Vehicle Bypass in Eltham. The excavation for the first of the concrete sections has been completed by the Contractor, and boxing and steel placement has begun. The first concrete pour will start next week. The replacement watermains (that form part of the original project) will be pressure tested this week above ground, before installation in the coming weeks. There have been no traffic or pedestrian issues reported to date, and the single traffic lane operating under traffic lights for both light and heavy vehicles is working well.
